#### Year 12 Valedictory Dinner/Celebration Day

Recently we acknowledged the end of the teaching and learning program for Year 12 students. A whole school Celebration Day Assembly with students from all year levels was held and we publicly acknowledged and recognised their achievement. The maturity and understanding demonstrated by all students on this day allowed for us to celebrate and showcase the journey of this cohort in a symbolic way.

A successful Valedictory Dinner/Graduation night was held at Lakeside Banquet and Reception Centre on Friday 14 November. The graduating class of 2022 received graduation medallions and certificates, with immediate family members enjoying this great occasion.

#### **Australian Mathematics Competition**

The AMC (Australian Maths competition) results for 2022 have been received by the College. Some excellent results have been achieved again this year. Students who scored a credit (21), or above (9), have excelled. There was one high distinction awarded this year – to Joel Linard of 8E. His results were outstanding, placing him in the top 2.5%.

#### **International Competitions and Assessments for Science**

The results for the recent ICAS Science test have come in. Across 69 students participating, 2 were awarded Distinctions (27 and 29 out of 40 respectively), 11 Credits, 1 Merit and 55 Participation Certificates.

#### **Awards Assembly**

Planning and preparations are underway for the annual awards assembly. This will be conducted in person on Thursday 24 November. An additional level of awards have been added to the program this year to reflect and acknowledge our College Values.

### Year 9 Media

This semester a new group of Year 9 students have been introduced to the subject – Media.

They have been studying the topic 'Representation' by exploring how representations in the media present ideas to the public through the use of codes, conventions and symbolism. They have also been learning about photographic composition techniques and how to apply relevant technical and symbolic codes to their own photographs to represent ideas and create aesthetically pleasing images.

During a double session, each student was randomly allocated a word and were required to produce a photographic image that represented that word. Careful thought went into how each student was going to construct their image, using representation, composition as well as camera and lighting techniques.

Students then voted for the work they felt was the most successful. Sam Lenssen, 9B, won the Peer Choice Award for his photograph representing 'fear'. Jia-Zhen Lu, 9E, won the Teacher Choice Award for her photograph representing 'rage'.

During another class, students completed a practical task where they were required to take a photograph representing themselves. *Jia-Zhen Lu, 9E, won the Peer Choice Award and Max Thorpe, 9C, won the Teacher Choice Award.* 

Congratulations to those who won the awards but also to all students who participated and produced work for each of these practical sessions. The class was highly invested in this task and showed skill in photographic production.

As the sun began to set Mr Nassiep had organised a few memory games for us to play like remembering everyone's middle name in the class (including the teachers), ending with lasagne for dinner that our cooking group had made. To top the night off we all watched the movie 'Grease' together, curled up in our sleeping bags which everyone loved. Then after the movie, we got ready for bed.

The rain continued pouring overnight and was forecast to only get worse, so sadly day 3 was our last. Soon after we were informed of our departure, we packed up our tents and suitcases in our trailer and our bus. After all the heavy lifting, we went to the Narana Aboriginal Cultural Centre to pet and feed some of the native animals, such as kangaroos and wallabies. Then to keep us going for the drive home, we headed over to Hungry Jacks and KFC for lunch and finally we all headed back to school. The camp was an extremely enjoyable and memorable experience for all of us, one that kept us engaged and learning no matter what we were doing. It was a type of experience that we would have had to forget about and cancel not so long ago, so collectively we are all incredibly grateful for those 3 days that we had together.

On 14 October 2022 our Year 12 cohort celebrated their final year at a dinner held at Lakeside Reception & Banquet Centre in Taylors Lakes.








### **Mathematics & Numeracy**






