Women in STEM

On 31 May 2023, ten girls were invited to Ecolinc to listen to guest speakers, participate in different activities and to meet female scientists to hear about their jobs and learn more about the fields they work/study in. At the start of the day we listened to a guest speaker (Ms Stephanie Quattromani) who talked about her job and how she is involved in STEM. Stephanie talked about her recent work in developing a drug for those suffering from Cystic Fibrosis. She also spoke about her past jobs and her education and how she has had a variety of jobs leading up to her current work in the medical field and introducing new medications/drugs. She spoke about how new drugs are tested, approved and released for use. After she had finished speaking, we were sent into different groups to do two different activities. One of the activities was us testing different DNA samples for different diseases and conditions. We learnt about DNA, different parts of DNA and what makes up DNA. We learnt how it can have deficiencies a.k.a 'typos' which can create different diseases or illness (or mutations).

We also learnt how to test the DNA for different things such as Cystic Fibrosis, Maple Syrup Urine disease, cancers etc. For the other activity we did blood smears/testing and urine testing. We looked at different blood samples and how the blood cells were placed or how they looked. We did this in order to identify different diseases. We tested the urine for things such as glucose levels (looking for things like diabetes). We also read the blood report and looked for abnormalities. After this we met different female scientists and learnt all about their jobs, what field of science they work in, and their education pathways. We each got to meet six scientists and after these meetings we had time to mingle with others or extend our previous conversations with those we already met. We all left feeling very positive about the role women play in science.

Year 10 Visual Art


The Year 10 Semester 1 Visual Art class explored the art medium of dry-point etching. They created prints of people in their daily lives that they feel a sense of belonging with.

Melbourne University – school of Maths and Statistics Incursion

The students played 'The Pebble Game' and were tasked with working out how they could always win. Can you work it out?

Set up:

- Arrange the objects in 3 piles
 - The piles may be of different sizes
- Decide on a player to go first

Gameplay:

- A player selects exactly one pile and removes any positive number of objects from that pile
- The opposing player then takes their move

Winning:

• The player who takes the last object wins



Students are encouraged to be active learners through our many and varied classroom activities. These could be participating in inquiry problem-solving lessons, joining in class discussions, choosing the best answer and defending their choice in 'Move n Prove' or using manipulatives or software programs to understand concepts.

Students from 8E participated in a scavenger hunt as part of their exam revision on measurement. They were allocated different starting points around the room and had to calculate their answers, with working out, then find their answer on another sheet and continue until they had done all 10 questions. Lots of discussion and collaboration abounded. Well done 8E!


