


## International Women's Day


## Forensic Science


The students used all the skills they have been learning to collect and analyse physical evidence left at the crime scene and try to identify the killer!

## Mathematics & Numeracy

### Essential Assessment & Oxford Maths: Year 7, 8 and 9

Most students have started to use Essential Assessment to complete some pre-tests. Teachers will use the results to target student learning gaps more effectively and students will be able to work on the 'My Numeracy' portal to check their understanding. A learning library with videos of key concepts is available for content from levels Foundation to 10A.

Students will need their laptops in class to use Essential Assessment and to access their digital textbook. The Oxford Maths online program allows teachers to set work at appropriate levels for all students regardless of their starting point. More support or extension can be accommodated.

### Maths Olympiad (Year 7 and 8) Round 1: Wednesday 8 May



This competition builds on important mathematical concepts and helps students to consolidate strategies and develop their problem-solving skills. It also provides high achievers with an opportunity to compete against themselves and others across Australia.

Students answer 5 problem-solving questions over 4 rounds. No notes or calculators are allowed. There are practice questions and resources available. Teachers will also go over solutions after the competition to ensure students continue to improve their maths problem solving skills.

Students in Year 7 and 8 ACE classes are automatically enrolled. If your child is a high performer in maths and would like to participate, please let their maths teacher know.

## Robotics

### **Robotics: Sunbury Schools FIRST Lego-League**



SDC Year 7 and 8 students are participating in the Sunbury Schools FIRST Lego League Challenge again this year.

This program has 4 key components:

- **Robot Design:** Design and program a LEGO Spike PRIME robot to follow lines using sensors, push objects or pull levers as they negotiate the mission mat.
- **Robot Game:** Complete as many missions as possible on the Challenge mat in 2.5 minutes. Each mission scores points.
- Innovation project: As a team, develop an innovative solution to a competition problem.
- **Core Values**: Throughout the competition students must demonstrate the core values of Teamwork, Inclusion, Impact, Fun, Discovery and Innovation.

The first workshop with all Sunbury schools was held on Friday 8 March.

### **Homestays needed for International students**

As part of the International Students Program, students will require homestay provision through which accommodation, meals, internet facilities and services (e.g., meals, gas, electricity, desk, etc.) are provided by the nominated homestay provider. The homestay experience is an excellent way for students to improve their English, learn more about Australian culture and to make the most of their International education experience. It is essential that homestay accommodation is in compliance with the Department International Student Program Quality Standards. In preparation for our intake of International Students in 2025, the College welcomes expressions of interest from families who are interested in providing homestay. Weekly fee that students pay for homestay is \$320.00.
