Year 12 Valedictory Dinner/Celebration Day

Recently we acknowledged the end of the teaching and learning program for Year 12 students. A whole school Celebration Day Assembly with students from all year levels was held and we publicly acknowledged and recognised their achievement. The maturity and understanding demonstrated by all students on this day allowed for us to celebrate and showcase the journey of this cohort in a symbolic way.

A successful Valedictory Dinner/Graduation Night was held at Lakeside Banquet and Reception Centre on Friday 13 November 2023. The graduating class of 2023 received graduation medallions and certificates, with family members enjoying this great occasion.

Sunbury Schools - Numeracy Community of Practice

Mathematics and Numeracy teachers from Sunbury Downs College and Sunbury Primary Schools are collaborating in a community of practice. The aim is to improve teaching capacity in the middle years in the subject area of mathematics and numeracy. Curriculum development, resource sharing, teaching pedagogy and classroom observations are important components of the learning project. Student transitions and school partnership development are also being further strengthened.

Australian Mathematics Competition

The AMC (Australian Maths Competition) results for 2023 have been received by the College. Some great news received from the AMT (Australian Maths Trust). Three of our students have qualified to an invitation only event – the AIMO (Australian Intermediate Mathematical Olympiad) based on their results in the AMC.

This event is a highly challenging, 4-hour problem-solving competition that was conducted in late September. The students are Connor Ferguson (8E), Joel Linard (9E) and Kush Tathed (10E).

Minor Capital Works Building Program – Student Amenity Upgrade

Building works have commenced on the upgrading of the Middle Years and Later Years Student amenities. The works have been divided into two smaller projects – Middle Years (1) and Later Years (2). We anticipate that the first stage will be completed in mid-December 2023 and the second stage will conclude in early February 2024.






Year 9 Camp


Year 10 Geography



Maths & Numeracy





Hands-on learning is always helpful to understand the concepts in mathematics.

Year 8 to 10 exam preparation

To be successful in mathematics, you need not only to read, attend class, and study, but you must practice the skills as often as you can. Mathematics is not a subject you learn by watching; you must DO mathematics to LEARN mathematics.

Key steps to revise for assessments: Do your revision tasks and

- 1. Practice redo questions you have done before. Cover up the working out and see if you can remember all the steps. Use worked examples from your index book or textbook to help you.
- 2. Draw diagrams. It's often useful to draw a picture or use models to help understand a question. Use the space available to do this.
- 3. Know your vocabulary. Many maths words have different meanings to their normal English word definition. eg. volume, net, simplify, difference.
- 4. Show your working out. It's expected that working out is done for all questions, including multiple choice. There is space provided to write next to the question, use it.
- 5. Read questions carefully. Highlight key words and instructions. Read to the end of the sentence (eg. write your answer to 2 decimal places). Re-read the question again after you have done a calculation to see if you have answered the question asked.
- 6. Know how to use your calculator, and bring it to each class and assessment.
